I am updating the ancestry of my grandfather, Percy B Zerby. I began researching my grandparents 30 years ago. I even created a website, aldorrfamily.com to enable me to share the information with other members of the family. My main reference was a chapter in Dr. Vallentine's Vallentine Family History 1980 plus whatever I could find in the internet which was not much at the time. I even exchanged several emails with Dr. Vallentine which I appreciated his patience with a beginning genealogist since it was all new to me. After 30 years I am going back and updating what I had done before. I was very pleased and surprised that one of the leading genealogists, Dr. Vallentine, had written a book on the Zerbe's, Martin Zerbe of Tulpenhocken: and his Zerbe descendants. At the age of 83 I am really leaning on his work very heavily.

Percy Zerby, our grandfather, is a direct descendant of Martin, the first Zerbe who came to America.

First Generation

1. Percy Brandon ZERBY, son of John Horace ZERBY and Nancy Hannah BRANDOM, was born on 2 Feb 1886 in Carrollton, Carroll, Missouri, United States, ¹ was christened in 1886 in Carroll, Missouri, United States, died in Mar 1963 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, United States, ² at age 77, and was buried in 1963 in Memorial Park Cemetery, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, United States. ²

Percy B. Zerby was a loving and gentle person with a gift for words. He did not go to college but he loved to read and always had a collection of books. His parents moved to Supply sometime after 1900. The 1910 census records for Supply show Percy was married to Lulla May and was the assistant cashier of the Supply bank. Lulla and Percy divorced and he marred Ora Million who owned the bank.

In 1911 Percy's future father-in-law, Burrell Million, bought the bank. In 1917 he married Ora Million, Burrell's daughter and their only child, Maxyne Cecilia Zerby Dorr, was born in 1919. Percy eventually became vice president of the bank and was also the treasurer of the town of Supply. The family lived in the largest home in Supply and was very much involved in society life. They would have dances in the ballroom on the second floor of their home. The bank moved to Woodward in 1929 in an attempt to survive the depression. In 1930 the bank failed and merged with the Bank of Woodward. At one time he was the president of the State Banking Association. The depression had a devastating effect on Percy which he never recovered from. Around 1938 when his daughter entered college, he started working as a clerk in the Oklahoma Highway Department in Perry, OK. Ora and Maxyne moved to Stillwater so Maxyne could attend Oklahoma A&M. He would sleep on a cot in a closet at the Highway Department during the week and go to Stillwater on the weekends. He remained a clerk until he retired 25 years later. He walked

to and from the Highway Department every day. He never drove a car.

He loved his garden and was a great grandfather. His grandchildren called him "Nini" and Ora, "Mimi." He loved to work in his vegetable garden while Mimi would work with her flowers. The last few years of his life he and Ora moved to Oklahoma City to be close to Maxyne and Sam.

The following is a transcript I found among my Grandfather's papers. I have not been able to find any additional pages'

Started July 27, 1951

This is a History of My Life written by me in the 65 years of my existence. Written for the information of my sons and my grandsons, my daughter, their wives and husband.

It is written without any intention at literary excellence, but as a single recording of one who I hope has had the affection of those who I love and respect so dearly.

I am the eldest of a family of eight - 5 boys and 3 girls, listed as their births came:

Percy Brandom Zerby (myself), Martin Leander, Harry Lewis, Ross Morris, Sarah Elizabeth, Thomas Edward (died in infancy, the only one that is deceased at this date), Ella Allen, Emily Adeline.

My first remembrance of the stern realities of life and as I look back now from the experience of years is the poverty of the house I lived in and the privations of Father and Mother. I am told that I was 3 months old when with my mother we joined my father in Comanche County, Kansas where he had staked a claim.

My very first recollection is the box trap which my father made to catch what we called snow birds. He sprinkled some small grain on the ground and then propped up the box on a stick to which he had attached a string long enough to

reach the door of our sod shanty. When the little birds gathered in large numbers under the box and were busily eating the grain he jerked the string and usually one drop was enough to catch a sufficient number to make an ample snow bird pie which served as our meat for the meals - breakfast, dinner and supper. Even there our poverty as I look back on it was delightfully forgotten by me in the ample satisfaction of a filled stomach.

I recall that fathers would be gone for several days at a time and I would with my mother go out over the prairie and gather Buffalo chips, the name they gave from the dropping of the cattle dung, and this we used for fuel. At last Father would return and he would have a great load of logs which he had gathered in the Oklahoma strip. And by the way this was on the Indian Reservation and near the town of Supply, Oklahoma to which we many years after moved and lived near, the history of which will come later.

While in Kansas Martin and Lewis were born. Finally the rigors and the poverty entailed in this frontier were too stringent for a young wife and 3 small children so we packed our scanty belongings into a covered wagon and made the trip overland to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Even there in vigor and location gave promise for the great city that now is the capitol of the State of Oklahoma. Here was born Ross Morris. I remember but very little of our stay there.

However we again took to the covered wagon and we traveled back to Wakenda, Missouri. My father worked for an uncle of mine, Uncle Ed Brandom. He was the owner of considerable land and had a large two story house, large farms, a grist mill where he ground corn for his cattle and hogs, mules and horses aplenty. He was a large stock man and kept a large number of steers on full feed all the time we lived there. He was a very resourceful man. He owned a hardware store and flour mill in Wakenda, Missouri which was just a mile north of his ranch.

I go into detail here for the reason that here in this location I received the deep impression of the vicissitudes of life. The generosity and the cruel injustice of human conception in relation to one another even among your relations. Here was an uncle, the brother of my mother, in these days a man of

wealth, a religious man. A Deacon in the Baptist Church, Superintendent of the Wakenda Baptist Church. A man of influence and as I recall him a gentle man. But with a mental complex about money that I never understood, as evidenced from a period years after. I had made a trip back to Missouri and bought our house in Supply from the party who owned it and who lived in Missouri. On my way back home I came through Carrollton, Missouri and Uncle Ed was living there with his only daughter. He drove me down to the old house which he still owned and in which his youngest son was now operating. As we passed the old Cary Graveyard where his first wife's people and in which she was buried, and also his oldest daughter Sadie. The weeds covered the cemetery ground and I remarked at the wretched conditions. When he answered with these words, "Tut-tut, it is shameful. You know I give them 50 cents a year to keep it in condition," I almost fell out of the car. But I conceived in my mind then that the man had a mental complex about money. Evidently sacred to him. No conception of the value in relation to relief of suffering humanity. No conception of his disgusting miserly hoarding.

This diversion in my life story is made to give you a possible reason for the scenes and events that I now will make.



Percy married **Ora Cecilia MILLION**, daughter of **Emma Catherine KELL**, on 18 Jun 1917 in Enid City, Garfield, Oklahoma, United States. Ora was born on 18 Jul 1876 in Shelbina, MO. Williamstown??, died on 27 Mar 1968 in Oklahoma City, OK, at age 91, and was buried in Memorial Park Cemetery, Oklahoma City, OK.



In 1916 Ora married Percy B. Zerby who was working in her father's bank. She actively worked in the bank untill 1931 when the bank failed. After the bank failed the family moved to Lone Wolf. When Maxyne, her daughter, went to school at Oklahoma A&M she moved to Stillwater and Percy took a job with the highway department in Perry. After Maxyne married she then moved to Perry. She remained in Perry until her later years when she moved to Oklahoma City to be near her daughter. While in Perry she enjoyed her flower gardens and the





John Horace "Harry" Zerbe moved from Carroll Co., Mo., to Comanche Co., Kan., about 1883, and from there about 1890 to Oklahoma City, where he lived only a short time before moving back to Carroll Co., where his last four children were born. When residing with his family in Combs Twp., Harry was listed as a farmer in the 1900 Census of Carroll Co., Mo. (A217).

hey spent a number of years in Supply, OK in the early 1900's. Their son, Percy, was working for the bank in 1910 and another son, Ross, was married in Supply in 1913. The 1920 Census shows John residing in Cimarron, Major County, OK. Around 1925 John and Nancy moved to Coldwater, Kansas to live with their son, Martin L. Zerby. Two years later Nancy passed away. John died at the age of 92 in his son's home.³

Lewis E. (possibly Lewis Elias [E8]) was listed as a laborer when recording in his parents' household in the 1850 Census of Morgan Co,, residing in Concord (A154). Prior to 1870 Lewis died and his widow Elizabeth married (2) Adam H. Zerbe (1346), his younger half brother; his three children by Elizabeth resided in Concord Twp. with Elizabeth and Adam H. Zerbe's household

when recorded in the 1870 Census of Morgan Co. (A195a).

John Zerbe, father, was appointed administrator of Lewis E. Zerbe's estate on 4 Nov 1864 (B43, #2278), with John F. Zerby witnessing, the widow Elizabeth having relinquished her right to administer. Since Lewis E.'s brother William H. had been in partnership with him in farming and nursery production and had preceded him in death by only one month, both estates were administered as a combined estate. The application for administration of Lewis E.'s estate documented he had left a widow and two children Lorenzo L. and Horace G.; the birth of his daughter Clara did not occur until several months following his death.

Lewis H. left in his estate personal property of about \$2000, consisting principally of his undivided half of the combined partnership with his brother William M. Additionally, the partnership real estate consisted of a house and lot in Sec 30 (Twp. IS Range 11) in Morgan Co. plus tracts of 120 a., 79 a, 20 a., and 36 a., in the Concord vicinity. Equal distributions of \$44.97 were made on IS June 1368 to John Zerby, Rachel Zerby (parents) and [Jacob?] Zerby, John F. Zerby, Ella Zerbe, Eliza J. Brennan, Adam H. Zerby, and Jarred Zerby (siblings); it appears probable that these distributions were made from William M.'s part of the combine estate. (Alll, A164, A195a, B43, C39, C40, C10S, D8, D24, D27, D23)

16. Jacob ZERBE, son of **Christian ZERBE** and **Maria Christina STRAUSS**, was born on 7 Feb 1782 in Rehrersburg, Tulpehocken Township, Berks, Pennsylvania, United States, was christened on 17 Mar 1782 in ., and died in Jun 1841 in Washington Twp., Snyder, PA, at age 59.

Following the birth of his first child Catherine in Berks Co., PA in 1805, Jacob's residence is unknown until 1809, when his second marriage occurred in Buffalo Valley, Union Co., PA. In 1820 he appears in the census of White Deer Twp., Union Co., PA. He next appears in the records of the Lutheran Church at Beaver Springs (then Adamsburg), Snyder Co., on 17 April 1824, when he communed and his daughter Catherine attended catechetical class.

Jacob received patent to land in West Buffalo Twp., Union Co., PA on 10 January 1829. On 15 May 1830 Jacob Zerby of Beaver Twp., Union Co., PA, miller, and wife Elizabeth sold 31 acres from his patent to Rudolph Vonneida of West Buffalo Twp. And later in 1830 and again in 1840 he was enumerated as a resident of Beaver Twp. However, his death occurred in June 1841 while he was a resident of Washington Twp., Snyder (then Union) Co., PA.

Letters of administration on the estate of Jacob Zerby, late of Washington Twp., deceased, were issued on 28 June 1841 to Jacob Smith and William Rushong. In his petition to the Union Co. Orphans Court (Dockets 3:552) on 14 September 1841, William Rushong, administrator, stated that Jacob died "about 3 months since" leaving a widow Eve and children John, Jonathan, Catherine (wife of George Rengler), Elizabeth, and G. Washington, the latter two being minor children. Roshong petitioned to sell the 81 acres in Washington Twp. of which Jacob died seized and located adjoining lands of John Mayer, Daniel Zerby, and others. Permission was granted and the land was sold to Peter Bolig on 22 February 1842.

The widow Eve Zerby on 1 December 1842 petitioned that a guardian be appointed for George Washington and Elizabeth, the two minor children of Jacob Zerby, deceased; and the court appointed Solomon Engel. On 22 May 1848 William Rushong, administrator of Jacob, reported to the court a balance of \$609.19 in his account. And on 14 February 1853, George W. Zerby, a minor

now 14 y4ears old and upwards, petitioned that Elijah Koch (an older half brother) be appointed his guardian, and the court so granted.

Attempts to prove the maiden surname of Jacob's first wife Elizabeth have been unsuccessful so far. That she was a local girl of Tulpehocken or Bethel Twp., Berks, PA seems probable. The only clue so far is that the sponsor at the baptism of her daughter Catherine in 1805 was Barbara Hamm or Hamen, but a follow up on this clue has revealed nothing positive so far. Palatine immigrants with surnames of Hamen and Hamm were in Hudson Valley settlements in New York in 1710-1712.

Christian appears in the Bethel Twp. tax lists from 1774 through 1790. He was a head of household in the 1790 Census of Bethel Twp., Berks, PA. On 15 March 1785 Christian bought his grandfather John Jacob Zerbe's farm from the heirs of his father, said farm comprised of 84-acre and 100-acre tracts. He and his wife of Bethel Twp. sold the farm to Conrad Christ on 18 April 1800. But they had then moved to White Deer Twp., Union Co., PA in time to be enumerated there in the 1800 Census.

As trustees of St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Kelly Twp., Union Co., PA, Christian Zerbe and George Reininger on 13 August 1802 received 7 acres for school, church, and cemetery purposes from Jacob Lutz, executor of Phillip Stahl, and John Stahl of Phillip. On 4 November 1815 the same two men deeded half interest in the Lutheran Church (i.e. St. Peter's) to the Presbyterian congregation (i.e. St. John's German Reformed), thereby enabling joint legal use by both congregations. Although both congregations now have separate church buildings, at that time they shared a union church building. It seems almost certain that Christian and wife Christina were buried in the old cemetery there.

On 20 April 1801 Christian Zerbe of White Deer Twp. bought 157 acres in White Deer Twp. from Richard Sherrer and wife Hannah. This was apparently his home for a few years. Christian and wife Ann sold this land to Peter Haas; they received a mortgage back from the grantee on 3 May 1810. Christian married (2) Mrs. Anna Sauser in Union Co. on 16 May 1809. Christian Serbe was enumerated with his wife and a girl aged 10-16 years in the 1810

Census of West Buffalo Twp., Union Co., PA, where they had apparently removed shortly before. Although he was now at least five miles from St. Peter's Church located in northern Kelly Twp. near the White Deer Twp. line, Christian apparently continued on as an officer therein until his death.

Christian Zerbe of West Buffalo Twp. made his will on 25 April 1817 and it was probated after his death on 20 November 1818 (Union Co., PA Wills, A:103). He named his 11 living children including <u>Jacob</u>, gave to his youngest son Samuel the land bought of John Piper, provided for his wife Elizabeth, and appointed his friend George Englehart Sr. to be his executor. About 1824 the executor petitioned the Union Co. Orphans Court (Records 2:198) that Christian had died seized of two contiguous tracts of land in West Buffalo Twp. totaling 155 acres of land adjoining lands of David Homiler, Christian Derr, and Nicholas Egbert. The estate stood indebted to John Ringeler, Jacob Stahl, Abraham Painter, Peter Weidner, John Ray, and Daniel Ringeler, and permission was granted to the executor to sell the land to pay off the debts. Christian reportedly died leaving a step-daughter named Sarah Young.

John's birth and baptismal dates are recorded in the registers of the Lutheran Church in New York City, probably the home church of the minister who baptized him. When married by the famous Rev. John Casper Stover in 1744, he entered their names as John Zerwe and Catarina Stup. It seems certain that it was this John Zerb who was an original signer in 1743 on the rolls of Christ Lutheran Church. The only other man by this name of appropriate age was John's uncle, John the Miller (i.e. John Japhet son of Martin). However, the latter seems unlikely since John the Miller had previously joined the Moravian movement, and Christ Lutheran Church had been formed primarily as a result of the Moravians having taken over the old Rieth's or Zion's Lutheran Church.

John Zerbe is entered on the tax rolls for Tulpehocken Twp. for 1754, 1758, 1760 and 1765 and probably is the <u>Hans Zerben</u> on the tax roll for 1770. It does not appear that John owned land for several years after his marriage and until he eventually bought the two tracts of land comprising his father's farm in Bethel Twp. From his brothers Michael and Valentine Zerbe, John bought 84 acres on 14 November 1768 and 100 acres on 16 November 1768. After John's death his heirs on 15 March 1785 sold these two tracts to his son Christian Zerbe (The Ancestor). It is probable that this farm was north of Rehrersburg and just across Little Swatara Creek in Bethel Twp.

Letters of administration on the estate of John Zerbe, the younger (i.e. younger than his uncle John the Miller), late of Tulpehocken Twp., deceased, were issued to the widow Catherine on 8 November 1776. This suggests that John may never have moved onto his father's farm in Bethel Twp. after he bought it. Petitions to the Berks Co. Orphans Courts (Dockets 2:251, 255) dated 12 and 13 November 1778 show that John died intestate leaving a widow Catherine and dying seized of both real and personal property. His daughter Margaret, a minor over 14 years, chose Jacob Strauss as her guardian. The court appointed Daniel Schneyder and Jacob Strauss guardians of Barbara, John and Daniel, all orphans

of John under 14 years.

Catherine apparently moved to the farm in Bethel Twp. after the death of her husband as she is recorded in the tax lists there in 1780, 1784 and 1785. In the year 1784 she was assessed for 50 acres in Bethel Twp., this presumably being her own dower assignment out of her husband's estate. It is probable that she was the <u>Widow Zerbe</u> residing in Bethel Twp. when the census was taken in 1790; the two females in the family were probably Catherine and her daughter Barbara.

Johan Jacob (often shortened to Jacob) resided in the German camps on the east side of the Hudson River in Columbia Co. at Annsburg and possibly also at Queensbury. He took an oath of allegiance to the British Crown at Albany on 17 Jan 1715/1716. After moving to the Tulpehocken region of Berks Co., Pa., sometime after 1725, it appears he first settled east of his father, Martin, on Mill Creek. Drawings of land surveys show that the second tract west from the mouth of Mill Creek at its confluence with Tulpehocken Creek had been surveyed for him. However, since no deeds have been found for this tract, it is probable that Jacob

sold his survey before a deed or patent was ever issued to him. A Jacob Zerbe Sr. in 1758 and a Jacob Servey in I765 appear on the taxlists of Tulpehocken Twp., but this probably refers to has apparent son Jacob Jr. who married Anna Elizabeth Spiess. Jacob Sr. was an original signer of Christ Lutheran Church.

By 1752 John Jacob moved with his family to Bethel Twp., Berks Co., where he has been found on the 1752, 1753, and 1754, and I760 taxlists. On 2 Jan 1753 Jacob Zerbe bought an 84 acre tract in Bethel Twp. from John Heberling and wife Barbara, but on 13 Mar 1764 he and his second wife Susannah of Bethel Twp., Berks Co., sold the land to their sons Michael and Valentine. Jacob bought another 100 a. of land on 6 Feb 1764 from John Heberling and sold the same tract on 16 Feb 1768 to sons Michael and Valentine. However, both tracts were later sold by Michael and Valentine to their older brother John Zerbe (THE ANCESTOR). Jacob Zerbe (Sr.) of Bethel Twp. made his will on 15 Aug 1776 but it was not probated until 19 Mar 1782, a short time after his death (Berks Co., Pa., Wills, A:40). He left 1/3 of the estate to his wife Susanna and the remainder to his living children, but his eldest son John was to receive only 1 shilling, having presumably already received his share. Leonard Zerbe and

Andrew Rigall witnessed the will. On 19 Mar 1782 letters testamentary on the estate of Jacob Zerbe, late of Bethel Twp., deceased, weaver, were issued to Nickolus Gauckler as sole executor; and Andreas Riegel and Leonhart Zerbe again witnessed. (B3, B38, B43,

B48, B41, B47, C2, C16, C18, C21, C22, E30, E53, E56, E60, E61, E65)

The Palatine Families of New York, Hank Jones, p 1137:

Johann Jacob Zerbe was confirmed 23 March 1712 at at Queensburg (West Camp Lutheran Chbk). Johan Jacob Server was naturalized 17 Jan 1715/16 (Albany Nats). Jacob Zerben and his wife Maria Catharina were listed next to Martin Zerber (and two names from Heinrich Winter) at Wormsdorff ca. 1716/17 (Simmendinger Register). Jacob Server was a Palatine Debtor in 1722 (Livingston Debt Lists). He was on the Tulpehocken Church lists of 1743. The will of Jacob Zerbe of Bethel was dated 13 Aug 1776 and probated 19 March 1782 (Berks Co. Will Bk A, p 40). Johann Jacob married Maria Catharina (probably Winter - HJ).

There are references in the Kocherthal records of the West Camp church showing children of a Johann Jacob Zerbe and wife Maria Catharina. Dr. J.F. Vallentine in his family history book showed the wife as Maria Catharina Winter. I wrote him as to the source of the name Winter (there was a Maria Catharina Winter in the West Camp). He replied that there is no record of their marriage and it was a guess on his part. Presumably one of Johann Martin's four sons to come over from Germany on Bulman's ship.

Jacob Zerben and his wife Maria Catharina were listed next to Martin Zerber at Wormsdorff ca. 1716/17. Jacob Server was a Palatine Debtor in 1722. He was on the Tulpehocken Church list of 1743. The will of Jacob Zerbe of Bethel was dated 13 Aug 1776 and probated 19 March 1782 (Berks Co. Will Bk. A, p. 40)." His will was written August 13, 1776 and probated March 19, 1782.

According to Dr. Vallentine (122(101)), Jacob lived "in the German camps on the east side of the Hudson River" and "took an oath of allegiance to the British Crown at Albany on 17 Jan 1715/1716." After 1725, he moved to Tulpehocken and apparently settled near his father on Mill Creek. According to the tax lists, by 1752 he had moved to Bethel Township.

In the late 1600's armies occupied parts of Palatinate Germany including the French and Saxon and Bavarian Armies. In addition, there was an extremely where virtually all commerce ceased and animals and humans froze. Queen Ann of England was sympathetic to what was happening to the Palatinates and told them she would send them to America. In return, they would help make naval stores for the Biriths Fleet and help fight the Indians. They sent advertisements to Germany and offered to pay them a bounty. About 15,000 Palatinates agreed to the offer and sold their homes and possessions in preparation for the journey to England.

Included in the Palatinates were Martin Zerbe, his wife and four sons all under 11. After floating down the Rhine River to Rotterdam, the family sailed for England in June 1709. The trip was made on Capt. Robbert Bulman's ship in the 4th party of Palatines. Philip Zerbe, Martin's brother, also made the trip, although his parents did not.

Martin Zerbst, Lutheran, husbandman and vinedresser, age 34, and his family appeared on a list of Palatine refugees at St. Catherine's, Deftford, and London.

On Chtirtmas Eve of 1709 Martin sailed with his family on one of 11 ships provided by the British Crown to the province of New York. It is presumed that Martin's brother Johan Philip came to America on the same ship. They arrived in New York on June 13.1710 in poor health and were housed on Nutten Island.

Martin settled in Livingston Manor, New York, at East Camp, also known as Annsburg and Wormsdorff. In Livingston Manor, each settler got lots of 40 feet

in the front and 50 feet deep. From 1710 to 1712 Martin appeared on Gov. Hunter's subsistence list, getting £91 in food and supplies. Martin, as Marte Server, was naturalized a British subject at the town hall at Albany, New York, on 17 January 1715/16. The last entry appears in February 1722, when the family moved to Tulpehocken Township in Berks County, Pa.

In the early 18th century, the Queen Anne's war broke out in the colonies, called the "War of the Spanish Succession". The settlers, including Martin Zerbe and his brother Philip, both of Annsburg, were required to serve, and on July 11, 1711 they marched to Canada. The men were enlisted from the village of Annsburg, New York and were in Captain Hartman Windecker's Company.

After their return from the Queen Anne's War, the governor took their weapons fearing a revolt. The settlers had trouble with Governor Hunter and left Livingston's Manor, moving to Schoharie, New York. Here, they had problems with the Dutch, who defrauded them of their land. The Governor of Pennsylvania heard about their problems, and wanting to populate Pennsylvania, invited them to move to there. In all, 33 families led by friendly Indians came to Tulpehocken Township, which was then located in Chester County, Pa.

After the war, the settlers had trouble with Governor Hunter who by now was broke and in debt and could not fulfill the contract with the settlers. The settlers from seven villages left Livingston's Manor and moved to Schoharie, New York. Here, they had problems with the Dutch who defrauded them of their land They also faced problems from Governor Hunter's men. The Governor of Pennsylvania heard about their problems and wanting to populate Pennsylvania, invited them to move to Pennsylvania. In all 33 families led by friendly Indians came to Tulpehocken Township which was then located in Chester County, Pa. Tulpehocken Township is bounded by the Blue or Kittany mountains on the north and Reading on the South where the Tulpehocken Creek unites with the Schuylkill River. In 1724, Zerbe was one of fifteen who signed a petition asking the Pennsylvania Government for titles to their land. Martin appears on the Tulpehocken Tax lists of 10-11 Jan 1726 and 2-4 January 1727.

Fell's Manor, where he settled, was in Chester County, Pa. Today, it is at Host's Post Office in Berks County. Martin had no deed to the property because deeds were not issued until after 1730 due to Indian difficulties. His son Johan Peter eventually received a deed. Fell's Manor is two miles from Myerstown,

Lebanon County beginning at Tulpehocken Creek at Rieth's Church in Strouchsburg and extending in a straight line, three miles in length to Host's Post Office. Martin Sharva's Run or Muhglbach (Mill Creek) is the name of the branch of the Tulpehocken Creek that empties in that stream near what is now Krick's Mill Post Office or Cross Key's Hotel.

Martin was survived by his wife Anna Elisabetha and four of his sons who were Johan Jacob (1698), George Peter (1702), Johan Japhet (1705) (the second of that name), and Johann Philipp (1708). The four sons along with the surviving daughters accompanied their parents to Tulpehocken or came shortly afterwards. All married— the eldest Johan Jacob before migrating from New York State— raised families, and maintained close Tulpehocken ties.

At one time, there were three Zerbe grist and saw mills within a one-mile radius of each other. Krick's Mill was operated by Lorentz Zerbe. Lorentz and Martin were the same people. It was operated before 1735 and then taken over by his son John and great grandson John Zerbe. the elder John became kmown as John thr Miller. It is located 2 ½ miles north of Charming Forge. 

He settled in France and came from Pariswhere some of his children were born, to Alsace, near Stras-burg, where it is supposed that his brother George and hisfather George lived, the Seviers and Serviers, as the name was spelled in France, being numerous in Alsace and Lorraine.

In the late 1600's armies occupied parts of Palatinate Germany including the French and Saxon and Bavarian Armies. In addition, there was an extremely where virtually all commerce ceased and animals and humans froze. Queen Ann of England was sympathetic to what was happening to the Palatinates and told them she would send them to America. In return, they would help make naval stores for the Biriths Fleet and help fight the Indians. They sent advertisements to Germany and offered to pay them a bounty. About 15,000 Palatinates agreed to the offer and sold their homes and possessions in preparation for the journey to England.

The family probably floated down the Rhine River to Rotterdam, where they sailed for England in June 1709. The trip was made on Capt. Robbert Bulman's ship in the 4th party of Palatines.

Martin's son, Martin Zerbst, Lutheran, husbandman and vinedresser, age 34, and his family appeared on a list of Palatine refugees at St. Catherine's, Deftford, and London. The elder Martin did not make the trip to Anerica with his sons. He amd his wife, Anna Elizabetha, remained in Kettenbach until there deaths.
